So the list “2009 Internal Partnership Inventory” has 120 items, not 193 (the partnership office list has many duplicate items). The items range from commercial leases e.g. the Grenadier Group food service at the golf clubs (but not Tuggs), to the groups contracted to teach the mandatory courses that kids have to take to work at PFR, to internal division connections e.g. with Toronto Public Health and the Police Services Board, to agencies who use city facilities for some programs, to de facto staff-run programs like the DGP pizza days, to small groups offering breakfast clubs, to Councillors’ one-off Canada Day events.

The Toronto Office of Partnerships [TOP] lists programs that predate the Office, along with some summaries that seem to have unexplained numerical codes. The Office has a brochure which advises people with a “bright idea” to make TOP their “first stop. We can guide you through the intricacies of the City’s organization and match your proposal with

the best fit among Toronto's priorities." The sample list of possible partnerships seems to offer mostly PFR options, and Phyllis Berck comes from there.

The FOI response included the Special Event application package and a brochure for "Trees Across Toronto," which invites corporate donations (over \$30,000 gets your company a sign at the planting site). Donations go through the Parks and Trees Foundation. Planting events seem to be run through LEAF. The Trees Across Toronto brochure lists accomplishments: "planted over 400,000 trees and shrubs....received cash and in-kind sponsorship donations of over \$1.5 million/draws over 4000 volunteers annually to plant..."
