In your email of April 22, 2012 to Denise Stuckless, you modified your requests to accessing the individual budget lines available to Dan Vala, Parks Supervisor for Ward 18 and 14 respecting Parks, and the budget lines available to the two recreation supervisors who are currently assigned to Ward 18: Glen Synowicki and Peter Lewis.

We asked staff of Parks, Forestry and Recreation to search again for records responsive to your modified requests. This decision reflects the results of their search. Access is granted in full to the records provided by Parks, Forestry and Recreation staff. A copy of the records is enclosed.

Further to my letter of May 9, 2012, I refer to your email correspondence with Margaret Liu, Access and Privacy Officer, regarding missing details and clarification about Ward 18 energy costs provided by Parks, Forestry and Recreation in response to your access requests 2012-00508, 2012-00678 and 2012-00679.

We referred your inquiries to staff of Parks, Forestry and Recreation for a response.

Access is granted in full to a detailed SAP table of Operating Expenditures Details for Ward 18 provided by Parks, Forestry and Recreation staff. A copy of the records is enclosed.

Below are the answers provided by Parks, Forestry and Recreation staff to your inquiries:

### 1. Missing Details

SAP tracks costs for certain services centrally either by district or by supervisor and a general ledger allocation to individual locations and functions are not available for all accounts.

The recreation supervisor would only see the total salary, not the names and hours in SAP Financial Inquiry module. They would have access to the names and total hours and associated costs of caretakers in a particular ward through Labour Distribution Reports, which are sent to Managers and Supervisors.

The Parks supervisor would not know how much of the Ward expenditures relate to particular activities such as washroom cleaning, night time closing. Allocation of time and materials and supplies expenditures correctly to activities requires a Work Order Management system. PF&R has a Work and Asset Management IT system that is currently being developed for implementation in 2013.

PF&R encourages all staff who manage a budget to get access to SAP Financial Inquiry module. Staff who request access receive a one day training and are able to use the system to conduct inquiries. It should be noted that SAP financial inquiry module does not provide names and hours charged. This information is available through the Labour Distribution Reports to Management Staff. SAP does not break down the total cost in a cost centre by activity. The supervisor would be able to see the total salary and materials costs in his cost centre but would not be able to differentiate which activities they relate to. This requires a work order management system, which PF&R is developing.

A supervisor who has access to SAP Financial inquiry module would be able to see all PF&R cost centres.

## 2. Wading Pools

a. Are there individual cost centres associated with those pools?

Wading pool expenses are tracked centrally. The breakdown by cost centre is not available.

b. What is the cost of the wading pool coordinators working only or partly in Ward 18?

The average seasonal cost of a wading pool is about \$13,000.

c. What is the cost of chlorine and testers, protective suits, and all other supplies (please break down to the same level of detail as the S.A.P. system breaks it down).

The cost of all supply lines have been provided in the detailed financial breakdown. Please see cost elements dedicated for Chlorine, Uniforms and other supplies as categorized from SAP.



d. How many aquatic CRP's are mainly or only assigned to the area that includes Ward 18?

There is the equivalent of 1.1 Aquatic CRP's for Ward 18's 2 Indoor and 6 Wading Pools. There is one full-time Aquatics CRP between McCormick and Wallace Emerson. An additional CRP operates a total of 24 wading pools in the summer as well as indoor pools in other wards.

# 3. Repairs and Maintenance

A detailed breakdown of the maintenance and repair costs for Ward 18 parks is not available. The detailed financial breakdown provides the annual costs and budget related to Technical Services for Parks in the entire South District.

- 4. Ward 18 Parks, Forestry and Recreation energy costs utility or energy costs records that are detailed enough to enable an understanding of how the following two sets of numbers relate to each other.
- a. 2012-00678 and 2012-00679 give the following "Utilities" costs for 2011:

Wallace: \$109,462 Dufferin Grove: \$34,147 Campbell: \$25,685

Ward 14 and Ward 18 parks utilities in total (under Parks supervisor Danny

Vala): \$38,350

The information provided includes utilities charged to the cost centres for an entire calendar year and includes hydro and natural gas. Due to the difference between meter reading dates of locations, the above may be slightly above or below the actual usage.

b. 2012-0508 gives the costs of "electrical consumption" for 2011 as follows:

Wallace: \$36,256

Dufferin Grove: \$24,429

Campbell: \$7,156.

This second set of information is requested directly from Facilities division and is for seasonal use and does not reflect the costs for a full calendar year. The meter periods for the three locations are as follows:
