This project provides for the rehabilitation of existing components. The Parks, Forestry and Recreation Division (PF&R) requires that all assets within it's portfolio be maintained in a safe and structurally sound condition, and not be allowed to decline into a state of physical or functional obsolescence. A capital project is categorized as state of good repair work if it provides for the capital maintenance, repair or replacement of existing assets.
