Food service and vending machines are available for refreshment throughout the Park. Private events may be held at a number of different locations within the Park. Public events are coordinated throughout
	the year in the Park.

	Design and Construction: Prospect Park Alliance restores the landscape and buildings within the Park while preserving the historic design. Projects are taken through a design and approvals process, in partnership with the City of New York Department of Parks and Recreation, and are then supervised during construction by the Prospect Park Alliance. Projects designed by the Prospect Park Alliance have won a number of prestigious
	awards. During the year ended 6/30/10, construction work progressed on the restoration of the lakeshore and the renovation of the Vanderbilt Playground. Construction was started on an artificial turf soccer field at the
	Parade Ground and the JFK monument at Grand Army Plaza was restored. Design of new bathrooms at the Parade Ground and at the Wellhouse continued and design of the Lakeside Center was largely completed. Design for the renovation of the Tennis House and the Garage Compound was started.

The Arboriculture Crew cares for         the roughly 40,000 trees of Prospect Park, including almost 150 different species which make up Brooklyn's only         forest. The Park provides priceless natural habitat for wildlife and for Park visitors, as well as a much-needed
	migration stop for thousands of birds. (Prospect Park has been designated an Important Bird Area by the National Audubon Society.) The Park's 250 acres of natural areas are maintained and monitored year-round by
	the Alliance's Natural Resources Crew, which works with volunteers and the Woodlands Youth Crew to restore new sections in the Park designated as natural areas. The Natural Resources Crew also engages youth through its work with both the Woodlands Youth Crew and the Brooklyn Academy of Science and the Environment. The President's compensation from the City of New York is subject to all of the reviews and approvals that are applied to similar positions. The Chairman of the Board of the Prospect Park Alliance reviews and approves the stipend paid by the Alliance to the President, taking into account the salary paid by the City of New York and the salaries of comparable positions at other organizations. The salaries of senior staff are reviewed and approved by the President and the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors. This review incorporates data drawn from relevant salary studies.
